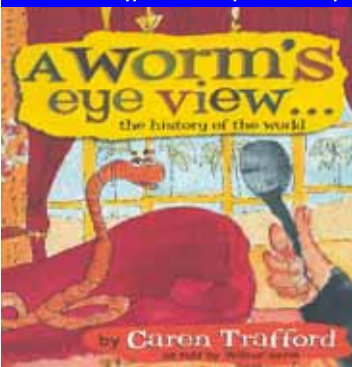
NSW Premier's Reading Challenge 2008
